V. Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.

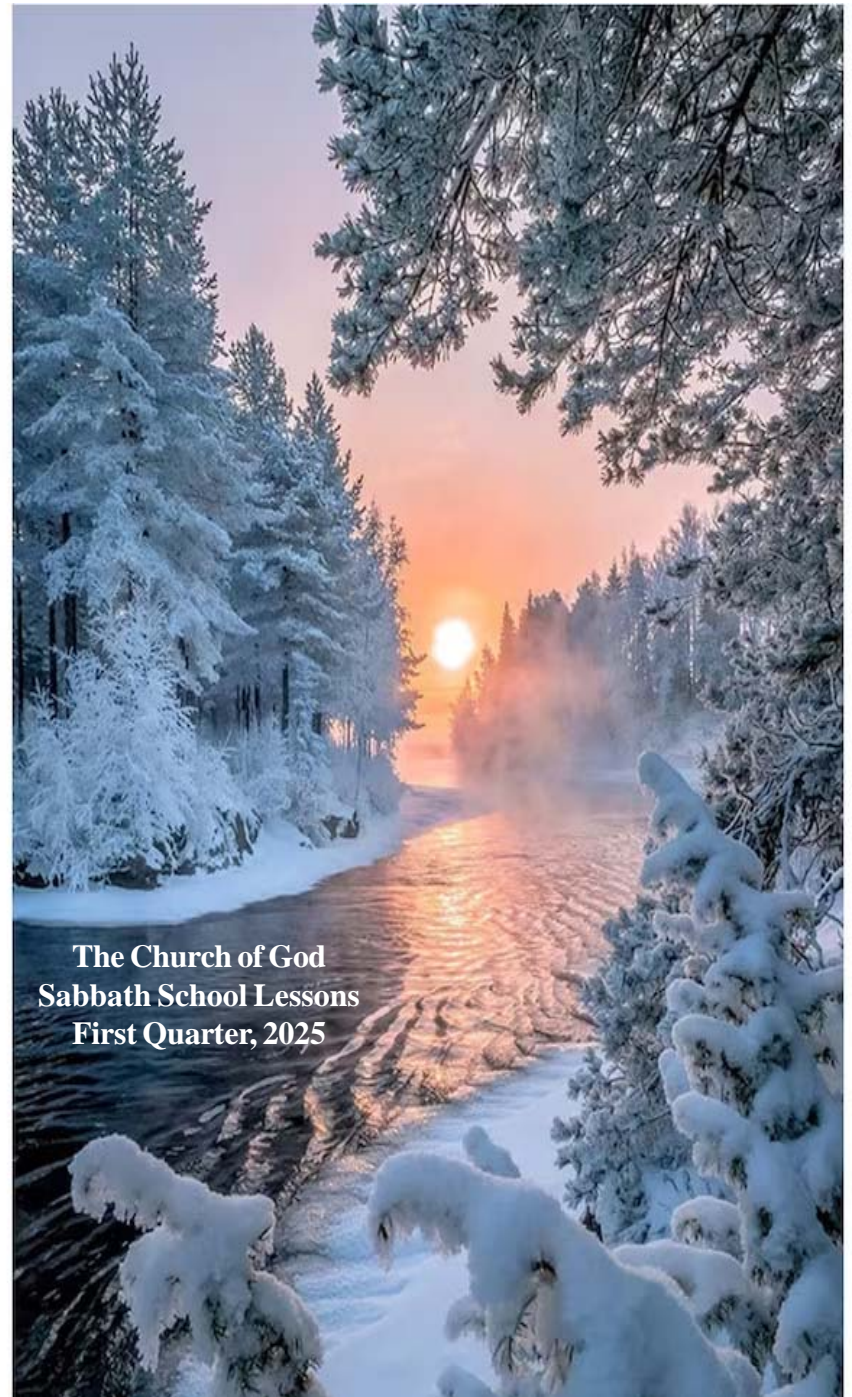
VI. Thou shalt not kill.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, January 4, 2025*

### PROPHECY ABOUT JESUS

**Scripture Reading: Genesis 3:14-22.**

**Golden Text: Genesis 3:15.**

1. What did Moses write about Jesus? Deuteronomy 18:15; John 5:45-46; Acts 3:22-23.

2. Did Jesus come from the tribe of Levi? Genesis 49:1, 8-10; Hebrews 7:14.

3. Where was He to be born? Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:1-6.

*NOTE: Bethlehem means house of bread.*

4. Was Jesus to be called the Son of God? Psalm 2:6-7; Hebrews 1:4-5.

5. Was He to be born of a virgin? Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:18-23.

6. Did men accept Jesus? Isaiah 53:1-3; John 1:11.

7. How was Jesus mistreated? Micah 5:1; Matthew 27:30; Mark 15:19.

*NOTE: They also scourged him and crowned Him with thorns before they crucified Him.*

8. How did Jesus react throughout most of His trial? Isaiah 5:7; Matthew 27:12; Mark 15:1-5.

9. Were His bones broken? Exodus 12:5-6; 46; John 19:31-37.

10. How did Jesus become the firstfruits of them that slept? Psalm 16:10; Luke 24:1-7; I Corinthians 15:20.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, January 11, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE CREATOR**

**Scripture Reading:** Genesis 1:1-2; John 1:1-3; Genesis 1:26-31.

**Golden Text:** Ephesians 3:9.

*NOTE: God the Father was the Architect and Jesus carried out His plan.*

1. While man was created from the dust of the earth, in whose likeness is he? Genesis 1:27; 5:1; James 3:8-9.

*NOTE: Strongs Concordance says the original translation of the word likeness is Similitude or Resemblance.*

2. Psalm 33 tells us more about Creation. Psalm 33:6-9.

3. How does Jeremiah further explain the creation process? Jeremiah 10:12-13.

4. Was Satan created? Ezekiel 28:13-15.

5. Will he be destroyed? Ezekiel 28:16-19.

6. To what is the House of Israel compared? Jeremiah 18:1-6.

7. What question is asked? Jeremiah 18:7-10.

*NOTE: While man was created to have eternal life, sin entered, and the bad pieces of pottery (man) will be destroyed as well.*

8. Why were we created? Revelation 4:11.

9. How did Jesus help His Creation? Hebrews 2:14-18.

10. Jesus did His part, what do we need to do? Revelation 22:12-14.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, January 18, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE SUFFERING SERVANT**

**Scripture Reading:** Isaiah 53.

**Golden Text:** Hebrews 5:8.

1. Did Jesus try to explain to His disciples the things He was to suffer? Matthew 16:21; Mark 8:31.

2. How did He compare Himself to Elias? Matthew 17:12; Mark 9:12.

3. Was suffering mentioned at the Passover? Luke 22:14-15.

4. How did Jesus respond to the Emmaus disciples? Luke 24:13-18, 25-27.

5. When He appeared to the 10 Apostles, what was part of His message? Luke 24:36, 44-48.

*NOTE: It seems that many of His followers did not realize He had to suffer and die.*

6. How was Jesus able to purchase the Church? Acts 20:28.

7. What else was His blood able to do for us? Revelation 1:5; 7:14.

*NOTE: The last part of Hebrews 9:22..."without shedding of blood is no remission." Jesus had to suffer and die so He could be raised from the dead.*

8. Paul addresses the importance of Christ's resurrection. I Corinthians 15:12-19.

9. In Peter's second sermon does he witness about Jesus' suffering? Acts 3:12-13, 17-18.

10. While we are partakers of Christ's sufferings, what will the future hold? I Peter 4:12-16.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, January 25, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE MESSIAH**

**Scripture Reading: Daniel 9:20-27.**

**Golden Text: Genesis 12:3.**

*NOTE: According to Strong's Concordance the word Messiah #4899 in the Old Testament means anointed, usually a consecrated person such as a king, priest or saint.*

1. How is Jesus referred to in Daniel 9:25?
2. He is Prince of what in Isaiah 9:6?
3. Acts 3:12-15?
4. Revelation 1:5?  
*NOTE: The footnote explains the word prince in Revelation 1:5 means ruler.*
5. What did Andrew tell his brother Peter? John 1:40-41.  
*NOTE: Christ is Greek for Messiah.*
6. Did Jesus confirm that He was the Messiah to the Samaritan woman? John 4:21-26.
7. Was the name Christ used in Jesus' lineage? Matthew 1:1,16.
8. How did the angel announce His birth? Luke 2:8-11.
9. When Jesus asked his disciples, "Whom do men say...I...am", what did Peter respond? Matthew 16:13-16.
10. Did Jesus want the disciples to tell people He was the Christ? Matthew 16:20.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, February 1, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE TRUE LIGHT**

**Scripture Reading: John 1:1-14.**

**Golden Text: John 8:12.**

1. Was John the Baptist the Light? John 1:6-8.
2. What was his witness? John 1:29-34.
3. How long is Jesus the light of the world? John 9:4-5.
4. Will we stumble if we walk in the light? John 11:9-10.  
*NOTE: Walking in the light is allowing Jesus to light and guide our path.*
5. Of what are we cautioned in the gospel of Luke? Luke 11:33-35.
6. What happens when there is "no part dark" within us? Luke 11:36.
7. What is the condemnation spoken of in John 3:19-21?
8. How does Jesus express a similar thought? John 12:46.  
*NOTE: Everything about God, Jesus, and the plan of salvation is not hidden but out in the open.*
9. How is that very note expressed? II Corinthians 4:3-6.
10. What was the Kingdom full of when the fifth angel poured his vial on the seat of the Beast? Revelation 16:10.  
*NOTE: Darkness is the opposite of light.*



## *Lesson For Sabbath, February 8, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE BREAD OF LIFE**

**Scripture Reading: Micah 5.**  
**Golden Text: John 6:35.**

*NOTE: Strong's Concordance tells us that Bethlehem, where Jesus was born, means House of Bread.*

1. When the Lord appeared to Abraham in the plains of Mamre what did Abraham do for Him? Genesis 18:1-5.
2. How does Lot help the two angels? Genesis 19:1-3.
3. What kind of bread is part of the Passover meal? Exodus 12:1-8.
4. What did Jesus use at the Passover meal to represent His body? Matthew 26:26.  
*NOTE: While the Lamb represents Jesus, once He sacrifices Himself, the unleavened bread represents His body at the Lord's Supper.*
5. How does Paul present these thoughts to the Corinthians? I Corinthians 5:7; 11:23-26.
6. What does Jesus say about the manna and Himself? John 6:30-33.
7. How did the people respond? John 6:34.
8. Jesus famously says in John 6:35.
9. Does He repeat this truth? John 6:45-51.
10. How does Jesus refer to the Lord's Supper? John 6:53-58; I Corinthians 10:16-17.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, February 15, 2025*

### **JESUS, THE GOOD SHEPHERD**

**Scripture Reading: John 10:1-10.**  
**Golden Text: John 10:11.**

1. Who do we find in the early pages of the Bible as a shepherd? Genesis 4:1-2.
2. When Samuel went to Jesse's house, where was David? I Samuel 16:1, 4-7, 10-11.
3. How does David start the 23rd Psalm? Psalm 23:1.  
*NOTE: While David was a shepherd, He realizes the Lord is a greater one.*
4. Asaph uses a title for us to read. Psalm 80:1.
5. What does Jesus say about the hireling? John 10:12-13.
6. What does the good shepherd know? John 10:14-15 (first part).
7. How is the good shepherd different from the hireling? John 10:15 (last part); 17-18.
8. Who else are part of the flock? John 10:16.  
*NOTE: The other sheep are the Gentiles.*
9. How did the disciples learn about the "other" sheep? Acts 10:19-22, 30-35; 11:1,18.
10. What did He say to the Jews at the temple? John 10:22-27.  
*NOTE: Shepherds are able to allow their sheep to mingle at a watering hole because the sheep know their shepherd's voice.*
11. What does Peter write about Jesus? I Peter 5:4.

## ***Lesson For Sabbath, February 22, 2025***

### **JESUS, THE SON OF GOD**

**Scripture Reading: Mark 1:1-11.**

**Golden Text: Luke 1:35.**

1. What did Gabriel call Him during his visit to Mary? Luke 1:28-32, 34-35.
2. Did demons even recognize who He was? Matthew 8:28-29; Mark 3:11.
3. After Jesus walked on water and calmed the sea, what did the disciples say? Matthew 14:25-33.
4. During the temptations by the devil, He was asked "If thou be the Son of God" then do this.... did it work? Matthew 4:3-4, 5-7.
5. When Jesus died what did the Centurion say? Matthew 27:50-54.
6. The following verse is seen many times at sporting events. John 3:16.
7. Why was Jesus sent into the world? John 3:17-18.
8. When witnessing to the Jews, He told them He was the Son of God. John 5:17-25.
9. The Apostle Paul confirms that God sent His Son into the world. Romans 8:1-3.
10. Was He tempted like we are tempted? Hebrews 4:14-15.

## ***Lesson For Sabbath, March 1, 2025***

### **JESUS' MINISTRY**

**Scripture Reading: Acts 1:1-10.**

**Golden Text: Revelation 12:17.**

1. After John was cast into prison, did Jesus begin His public ministry? Matthew 4:11-17, 23.
2. Was teaching the only thing He did in the cities and villages? Matthew 9:35.
3. When Jesus asked a question of the Pharisees, where was He? Mark 12:35.
4. Where do we find Jesus when He taught the beatitudes? Matthew 5:1.
5. After He gave His instructions to the disciples, where did He go? Matthew 11:1.
6. What did He use when there was a great multitude by the seaside? Matthew 13:1-2; Mark 4:1-2.
7. Where were they when Jesus taught them about the end time? Mark 13:1-4.
8. After the temptations by the devil, where did Jesus return? Luke 4:14-19.
9. What do we learn about Jesus' teachings? John 7:14-18.
10. When the High Priest asked Him about His doctrine, what was His response? John 18:19-21.

*NOTE: Jesus taught wherever and whenever He could. He used every opportunity to teach.*

## *Lesson For Sabbath, March 8, 2025*

### THE DOCTRINE OF JESUS

**Scripture Reading: Hebrews 6:1-22.**

**Golden Text: John 7:16.**

*NOTE: Jesus was very specific about the things He was to say and do, but we often read about other points of view which were incorrect, of course.*

1. The sermon on the mount is recorded from Matthew 5 to the end of chapter 7. What is written in Matthew 7:28-29?
2. What did He say to the scribes and Pharisees? Matthew 15:1-9.
3. What did His disciples report to Him? Matthew 15:12-14.
4. When asked a question by the Sadducees, what did His answer cause? Matthew 22:23-24, 28-33.

*NOTE: People were always astonished at His teachings.*

5. How did the scribes and chief priests react to Him? Mark 11:15-18.
6. What happened in Capernaum? Mark 1:21-28; Luke 4:31-32.
7. Why did Jesus use parables? Mark 4:1-3; 9-12.
8. Not abiding in the doctrine of Christ can have fatal results. II John 9-11.
9. How will we know this doctrine or teaching comes from God? John 7:17.
10. What did Moses write about the words of Jesus? Deuteronomy 18:18-19.

## *Lesson for Sabbath, March 15, 2025*

### THE MANY WITNESSES OF JESUS

**Scripture Reading: John 1:15-29.**

**Golden Text: John 1:34.**

1. One of the followers of John, Andrew, found Messias? John 1:40-41.
2. When Jesus told Philip, 'Follow Me', who did he tell? John 1:43-45.
3. How did Nathanael react? John 1:46-49.
4. Jesus got into a conversation with the woman at the well. When she made a statement, what was Jesus' answer? John 4:6-7, 25-26.
5. Did many of the Samaritans believe her? John 4:39. Many more believed Jesus. John 4:40-42.
6. When Jesus asked the disciples if they would leave after some left, how did Peter respond? John 6:60, 66-69.
7. After Lazarus died, Martha spoke to Jesus. John 11:20-27.
8. A sign of His accusations was placed on the cross. John 19:16-22; Matthew 27:37.
9. What did the centurion say when Jesus died? Matthew 27:50-54.
10. How did "doubting Thomas", react? John 20:26-28.
11. What did John himself write? John 20:30-31; 21:25.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, March 22, 2025*

### **THE REIGN OF JESUS**

**Scripture Reading: Isaiah 11:1-12.**

**Golden Text: Luke 1:33.**

1. What did Solomon write in the Psalm? Psalm 72:1-4.
2. How will He be dressed? Isaiah 59:17-20.  
*NOTE: His actions will be well thought out and just.*
3. Death reigned because of Adam; what did Jesus bring to us? Romans 5:17-21.
4. What other opportunity has been given to those in the first resurrection? Revelation 20:6.  
*NOTE: He is allowing the saints to rule with Him for 1000 years.*
5. Where will this reign be? Revelation 5:8-10.
6. Of what does Timothy remind us? II Timothy 2:11-12.
7. What happens at the 7th trumpet? Revelation 11:15.
8. How is the second coming described? Revelation 19:11-16.
9. How long must He reign? I Corinthians 15:25-28.
10. After Jesus turns everything back over to His Father, what does the throne room look like? Revelation 22:1-5.

## *Lesson For Sabbath, March 29, 2025*

### **THE PASSOVER**

**Scripture Reading: Exodus 12:1-14.**

**Golden Text: I Corinthians 5:7.**

1. What was the Lord doing when He passed through Egypt? Exodus 12:12.
2. What was the blood called? Exodus 12:13, 23.  
*NOTE: The Lord was to pass through Egypt (verse 12) and destroy, but pass over the Israelites (verse 13) as long as He saw the blood. The word token means signal.*
3. While the Israelites did not realize it, who did the lamb represent? John 1:29.
4. The blood of the lamb protected them; what does it do for us? I John 1:7; Revelation 1:5.
5. What else did He do for us? Acts 20:27-28.
6. Was the Passover to be repeated? Exodus 12:14, 24-25.
7. How were they to answer their children when asked, "What mean ye by this service?" Exodus 12:26-28; Deuteronomy 6:20-23.
8. Did Israel celebrate the Passover the following year? Numbers 9:1-5.
9. When the children of Israel returned from captivity, did they keep the Passover? Ezra 6:15-19.
10. Luke expresses the Lord's feelings about the Passover before He was arrested and crucified. Luke 22:7-16.  
*NOTE: The death of Jesus ended animal sacrifices, so He used that event to introduce the Lord's Supper.*
