"And Jesus answering said, A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves, which stripped him of his raiment, and wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead. And by chance there came down a certain priest that way: and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on him, and passed by on the other side. But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him, And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee" (Luke 10:30-35).

The parable of the good Samaritan shows both unconcern and compassion. The priest and the Levite who should have helped did not! The Samaritan, the one least expected to help, did! This Samaritan knew that the Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans.

What lessons can we learn from this Samaritan?

The Samaritan noticed the need of this half dead man and went to him with compassion. He bound his wounds. He did not hesitate to get this hands dirty. The man needed him, and the Samaritan helped him without hesitation. The Samaritan seized the opportunity to help this half dead

man. The Samaritan saw a helpless man, and helped him. He did not ask who he was or from where he came."But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?" (I John 3:17).

The Samaritan served the helpless man. He poured in oil and wine into the man's wounds and set him on his own beast. He brought him to an inn and took care of him at great expense.

The Samaritan shared his own time and money. "And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee" (Luke 10:35). This was real incomparable compassion!

The Samaritan stayed with the half dead man in his sorrow. Not only did he bind up his wounds and poured in oil and wine, but he also set him upon his own beast and took him to an inn where he paid out his hard-earned money. The Samaritan stuck with the helpless man all the way!

Sincere children of God have concern for those who need their help. They seize the opportunity to help those who need their help. They serve those who need their help. They share their goods with those who need their help, and they stay with those who need their help!

NATURAL HUMAN LOVE VERSUS LOVE IN THE SPIRIT

"As ye also learned of Epaphras our dear fellow-servant, who is for you a faithful minister of Christ; Who also declared unto us your love in the Spirit" (Colossians 1:7-8).

Epaphras, a minister, reported to Paul the condition at Colossae, declaring unto him the believers' "love in the Spirit." The saints at Colossae, we may conclude, had perfect fellowship, unbroken union, no gossiping tongues, no misunderstandings, no quarrels, no criticisms, no murmuring, and no bad feelings. Theirs was a Christlike love. Verse four calls it "the love which ye have to all the saints." There is a natural human love that all possess for some things. Love of country, love of mother, wife, husband,



and children are examples of natural human love.

Jesus summed up love in the Spirit when He said, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another" (John 13:34).

Let us consider some of the differences between natural human love and love in the Spirit.

Natural human love is an instinct and a passion. Love in the Spirit is the fruit of the life that is imparted by the Holy Spirit. Natural human love does go a little farther than animal love. But it is carnal, and it shall pass away. Love in the Spirit descends from above, and is part of the nature of God. The Spirit takes this love and puts it into

our hearts.

Natural human love is sometimes selfish and terminates upon its gratification. Love in the Spirit is unselfish and reaches out to the good of its object. Natural human love may turn into bitter hate if it is crossed or disappointed. It can deal vengeance to the very one for whom it would have given its very life for a few days before. The Apostle Paul told the Galatians, "And my temptation which was in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected; but received me as an angel of God, even as Christ Jesus. Where is then the blessedness ye spake of? for I bear you record, that, if it had been possible, ye would have plucked out your own eyes, and have given them to me. Am I therefore become your enemy, because I tell you the truth?" (Galatians 4:14-16). Love in the Spirit forgets itself and seeks to bless others, even its enemies. "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you" (Matthew 5:43-44). Love in the Spirit shrinks from no sacrifice to make others happy. It is impossible to love those who hate you without love in the Spirit. Jesus said, "...Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do..." (Luke 23:34). Stephen said, "...Lord, lay not this sin to their charge" (Acts 7:60).

Natural human love is attracted to the qualities of its object. Love in the Spirit blesses all, even the unlovely. Natural human love is attracted to the lovely, the good, and the beautiful. Love in the Spirit can take the unlovely and love them because God does. "He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love" (I John 4:8). "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

We can see a faint resemblance between motherly and divine love. Most mothers believe that they have a beautiful baby. It is easy for a mother to see beauty in her baby. Should a baby become fretful, sick, or become a constant trial, the mother still loves the child night and day and sacrifices for the baby's good. Love in the Spirit goes far beyond all other love. Love is listed first among "...the fruit of the Spirit..." (Galatians 5:22-23). Jesus said, "By

this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another" (John 13:35).

Natural human love is sensitive and fitful. It lives in the sunshine. Love in the Spirit is longsuffering, kind and true, even in the darkest hour of suffering and wrong. Natural human love depends on moods or feelings. It can love today and hate tomorrow. The attributes of real love in the Spirit are given in I Corinthians 13:4-7: "Charity (love) suffereth long, and is kind; charity (love) envieth not; charity (love) vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things." Love in the Spirit reaches out to those who cannot or will not return it. It prays for those who would despitefully use it and persecute it. The Holy Spirit alone can produce this in our hearts.

Natural human love is exclusive, partial and partisan. Love in the Spirit is comprehensive like the love of God. Natural human love has favorites. Love in the Spirit loves everyone. Natural human love many times does not like those who are not in the inner circle. Love in the Spirit is just and fair taking in the rich and poor; the high and the low; people of any color and race. It treats everyone right, and it is not selective. It does as much for one as the other.

Natural human love is intemperate. Love in the Spirit is moderate and self-restrained. In one moment a mother can hug her child with affection. In the next moment, she may bawl him out and give him a good whipping. A father can love his son, but allow him to satisfy his own wishes to his own hurt.

Love in the Spirit sometimes restrains and even dares to displease. Joseph is a good example. He loved his brothers, but he restrained his affection for them and held them as guilty men until they repented after which he forgave them. Please read Genesis 42.

These are just some of the differences between natural human love and love in the Spirit. To love God and love others in the Spirit is to love everyone regardless of the consequences.



The Revelation of GOD's Throne Room

Jesus, the last Prophet of the Bible, revealed many visions to the Apostle John when he was imprisoned on the isle of Patmos.

Revelation 1:1: "The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave unto him, to shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass; and he sent and signified it by his angel unto his servant John."

Two visions of GOD's throne room were most remarkable and revealing. Why? They give us insight into the supreme authority of our FATHER on HIS throne. We learn more about the nature of HIS Son Jesus. We come to understand the power of HIS Holy Spirit.

The first throne room vision is found in **Revelation chapter 4.** The scene is set. A door is opened in heaven **(verse 1).** John is invited to come up hither. There he stands in the Spirit looking on the most awesome place in existence.

John sees a throne, and ONE sitting on the throne that is bright as precious jewels shining beyond comprehension. This indescribable Being is none other than our FATHER in heaven. Around HIM is a rainbow showing HIS covenant to never flood the earth again (Genesis 9:11-13).

Revelation 4:4: "And round about the throne were four and twenty seats: and upon the seats I saw four and twenty elders sitting, clothed in white raiment; and they had on their heads crowns of gold."

The twenty-four elders are men who had been given new clean garments of white. Their golden crowns indicate rulership and authority.

Revelation 4:5: "And out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices: and there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven

Spirits of God."

Before GOD are seven lamps which are the seven Spirits of GOD. We do not see a throne beside HIM with a spirit being seated. No, the Spirit of GOD is not a person, but is before the throne of the FATHER burning as seven lamps.

Revelation 4:8-9 "And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come. And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on the throne, who liveth for ever and ever..."

Now we know for a certainty the identity of the One who sits on the throne, the LORD GOD ALMIGHTY.

We read on about this vision into Revelation chapter 5.

Revelation 5:2-4: "And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof? And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon. And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon."

No person was found worthy to open the book because "...all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Only Jesus lived a life without sin. He is able to open the book from the right hand of the FATHER.

Revelation 5:5: "And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seven seals thereof."

Jesus, the very Word of GOD, is the fulfillment of all Messianic prophecy. He is the Lion of the tribe of Judah and the Root of David. (Genesis 49:9-12; Matthew 22:41-45; Psalm 110:1). He became the unblemished Passover Lamb by fulfilling the feast. He was without sin (unblemished), was killed on the 14th of the month of Abib (Exodus 12:6), and had no broken bones (Exodus 12:46). Jesus fulfilled the only sign of the Messiah given to the mocking scribes and Pharisees by spending three literal days and nights in the tomb (Matthew 12:40), from Thursday evening until Sabbath evening as it dawned towards the first day of the week (Matthew 28:1). When John the Baptist saw Jesus he said, "...Behold the Lamb of GOD, which taketh away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). John was thinking of Jesus our Passover (I Corinthians 5:7).

Revelation 5:6: "And I beheld, and, lo, in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth."

Now John sees Jesus before the FATHER as a slaughtered Lamb, but made alive and caught up to the throne. The seven Spirits of GOD (**Revelation 4:5**) are now given to the LAMB and are seen as seven horns and seven eyes. Why are the seven Spirits depicted as horns and eyes? We'll have to go to Scripture for our answers.

There were horns fashioned on each corner of the altar (Exodus 27:2). And the blood of the bullock was put upon the horns of the altar. (Exodus 29:12). Here we see the horns represent sacrifice and atonement for the sins of the people, that mercy would be substituted for judgment.

The horn was filled with oil for the prophet and priest of GOD to anoint kings (I Samuel 16:1,13 and I Kings 1:39). The oil in the horn represented the Holy Spirit of GOD. As soon as David was anointed with the horn of oil, he was filled with GOD's Spirit. Now David had the power and authority to reign as king. Again in Psalm 18:2 the power of the horn is represented in GOD's salvation.

In summary, the horns represent power, authority, salvation, mercy and sacrificial atonement. Jesus is given this authority by the FATHER to rule in righteousness, to save HIS people.

First, as our High Priest.

Hebrews 4:14-16: "Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession. For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need."

Then, as King of Saints.

Revelation 15:3: "And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvellous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints."

Then, as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Revelation 19:16: "And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS."

We see the authority given to Jesus by the ONE on the throne.

Revelation 5:7: "And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne."

The FATHER gives the book to Jesus from HIS right hand of power. Jesus is the firstborn of the dead to receive the kingdom blessing of GOD's right hand. (**Matthew 25:33-34**). Now with this power and authority, Jesus can open the seals of the book. He is the only one found worthy (**Revelation 5:9**).

Returning to Revelation 5:6, we find, ".....having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth." The seven horns deal with power and authority. The seven eyes are the seven Spirits sent as all-seeing throughout the earth (Hebrews 4:12-13; Deuteronomy 11:12).

We come to understand the completeness of GOD's Spirit working through HIS Son Jesus. The seven attributes of the seven Spirits are revealed....

Revelation 5:12: "Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing."

So the seven horns represent power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing. Jesus receives His awesome royal and regal anointing.

In conclusion, the vision of GOD's throne room, revealed to John and written through inspiration of GOD's Holy Spirit, was set down through time that we may understand the salvation and mercy of GOD giving us HIS only Son (John 3:16). Also, that we may understand the victory Jesus had over death and sin (I Corinthians 15:57). Further, that we understand the true nature of the godhead. The mystery of iniquity teaches that God is triune, but we clearly see from this testimony that the FATHER is

supreme and gives HIS power, authority, and Spirit to Jesus for His inheritance and obedience unto death. There is no 3-part god. GOD the FATHER reigns over all, and Jesus, HIS Son, is made our Lord and Saviour.

Deuteronomy 6:4: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD." **Exodus 20:3:** "Thou shalt have no other gods before me."



THE THREE CUPS

The Bible speaks of many cups; there is Joseph's cup, and Pharaoh's cup, among others. But there are three cups mentioned which are very significant, especially in these closing days. If we earnestly drink from the first cup, there will be no need to drink from the other two. While, if we refuse to drink from the first, we are drinking from the second and will also drink the third.

The content of the first cup is very sweet; the second is very strong; and the third is very bitter. Let us now take a look at these cups.

In Matthew 26:27-29 we read "And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." When one accepts the gospel of Jesus Christ and becomes obedient, walking in the way of the Lord, he will partake of the Lord's Supper, which consists of unleavened bread and the pure fruit of the vine (the cup) representing the body and blood of our Lord.

The Apostle Paul made mention of this in I Corinthians 11:23-28, "For I have received of the Lord that which

also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come. Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup."

The second cup is found in the book of Revelation. "And the woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet colour, and decked with gold and precious stones and pearls, having a golden cup in her hand full of abominations and filthiness of her fornication" (Chapter 17:4). When one rejects the true teaching of Jesus Christ, he is drinking from this cup, accepting all the false teaching (doctrine) as presented by the god of this world. The Apostle Paul made mention of this in I Timothy 4:1-2, "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall de-

part from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils; Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron." Also in II Timothy 4:3-4, we read, "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; and they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." And again in II Thessalonians 2:11-12, we find, "And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness."


We will now look at cup number three. Psalm 75:8 reads, "For in the hand of the LORD there is a cup, and the wine is red; it is full of mixture; and he poureth out of the same: but the dregs thereof, all the wicked of the earth shall wring them out, and drink them." The Lord will be giving out rewards to all who have refused to obey Him, and have chosen to drink of cup number two. In this case, no one has a choice but every one has to drink from the cup of the Lord. We read in Jeremiah 25:15, "For thus saith the LORD God of Israel unto me; Take the wine cup of this fury at my hand, and cause all the nations, to whom I send thee, to drink it." At this time the Lord will

not have pity, and His eyes will not spare. "Now is the end come upon thee, and I will send mine anger upon thee, and will judge thee according to thy ways, and will recompense upon thee all thine abominations. And mine eye shall not spare thee, neither will I have pity: but I will recompense thy ways upon thee, and thine abominations shall be in the midst of thee, and ye shall know that I am the LORD" (Ezekiel 7:3-4).

The book of Revelation tells us more about this cup; "And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand, The same shall drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out without mixture into the cup of his indignation; and he shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels, and in the presence of the Lamb" (Revelation 14:9-10). See also chapter 16:19, last part.

Today we are fortunate that we still have a choice. The Lord is still calling and pleading with us to make the right choice. Now is the accepted time, now is the day of salvation. Tomorrow may be too late.

He that hath an ear let him hear.



"Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it' (Exodus 20:8-11).

This passage of Scripture not only shows that the seventh day of the week (Saturday) is the Sabbath, but it also proves that the physical universe was created in exactly six literal days. There is no allowance here for the universe being billions of years old; no allowance for evolution, theistic or otherwise; and no allowance for a "gap theory" between Genesis 1:1 and Genesis 1:2.

The theory of evolution is taught in virtually every public (and many private) schools and universities in the world. This demonic doctrine is being taught under the guise of scientific fact, and it makes a mockery of the Word of God, and accuses God of being a liar. Many people's faith in the Bible has been shaken because of the teaching of evolution, and thus, many will lose out on eternal life because of it.

Some claim that belief in evolution and belief in the Bible account of Creation can be reconciled in one series of events. This is called "theistic evolution" and its main teaching is that God began the evolutionary process some billions of years ago, and then let mankind (and other life forms) develop through various stages from primitive organisms. This belief, however, instead of reconciling science with the Bible, further complicates the matter.

The "gap theory" is the belief that between Genesis 1:1 and Genesis 1:2 a long period of time elapsed in which a cataclysmic destruction made the earth "without form, and void". According to at least one account of this theory, God's judgment was upon the fallen angels, causing this catastrophic destruction of a previously created earth. Scriptural passages such as Jeremiah 4:23-26 and Isaiah 24:1 are used as "proof" for such a judgment. However, when the context of these verses is read, it is apparent that these passages refer to a *future* judgment upon the earth.

Exodus 20:11 plainly informs us, "For in six days the LORD made heaven ('the heavens'--NASB) and earth, the sea, and all that in them is..." This simple, but all-inclusive, statement is God's Own testimony concerning the amount of time He chose to create the *entire* physical universe. This includes not only the earth and all it contains, but the multitudes of galaxies and everything in them as well.

The question might be raised at this point: How does one know if the six days of Creation are literal days rather than symbolic days? A partial answer to this would involve an examination of the context of the Scriptures of the Creation story given in Genesis chapters one and two. These two chapters of the Bible actually give an historic account of the creation of the physical universe by God, rather than a symbolic account. For instance, Genesis 2:4 records, "These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created..." The margin reads, "This is the history" (italics mine) for the phrase, "These are the generations". God is giving here the historical record of His creative work.

One very large problem of accepting the days of Creation as being symbolic is that if one part of Creation is symbolic then all of it may be. Indeed, this is what many liberal Bible "scholars" claim. They teach that much of the Genesis account of Creation is symbolic and is therefore not to be taken literally. They look at the days of Creation as a long period, or periods (epochs), of time in which evolution had a chance to come about. They refuse to accept the Sabbath as a literal day of rest for similar reasons. Some even mock at the account of Eve being created from a rib taken out of Adam's side.

Genesis 1:5, in referring to the first day of Creation, reads, "And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day." The Hebrew word for day used in this verse and in the rest of chapter one, is "yowm". Its usual meaning is a literal day of twenty-four hours. Now, when we add to this fact that God divided the "Day" from the "Night", and that the day consisted of "the evening and the morning", we have proof that the days of Creation were literal ones. We have already seen that the seventh day mentioned in Exodus 20:8-11 is a literal Sabbath day on which God's people are to rest. This is based on the fact that God, Himself, rested on the seventh day after His Creation was complete. Genesis 2:2,3 informs us: "And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made."

Jesus explained one of the purposes for which the seventh-day Sabbath was made. In Mark 2:27,28 He pro-

claimed, "...The sabbath was made for man, and not man for the sabbath: Therefore the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath." Since "the sabbath was made for man" ("man" being translated from the Greek word "anthropos" which means "mankind"), we know, therefore, that it was also made for Adam and Eve. This pair was created on the sixth day of Creation. Their keeping of the Sabbath, on the seventh day, is further proof that the Creation days were literal.

Let us now examine the fourth day of Creation from Genesis 1:14-19. "And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years: And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so. And God made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night: he made the stars also. And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth, And to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness: and God saw that it was good. And the evening and the morning were the fourth day."

Now we see that the sun, moon, and stars were created for the purpose of dividing the day from the night, and "for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years", and "to give light upon the earth". It has been suggested that these celestial bodies were not actually created on the fourth day, but rather were created aeons of time before, and then were only made to *appear* as lights that were hitherto shrouded in darkness. Notice, however, that it was on the fourth day that "God set them in the firmament of the heaven". This was not an act of *revealing* these luminaries, but rather it was an act of *placing* them "in the firmament of the heaven". The Lord is so awesome that He chose not only to create the earth, but also the rest of the physical universe within the six days of Creation!

The Lord Jesus Christ gave testimony to when the beginning of the Creation took place. He knew this from the witness of the Scriptures, and also because He was there at the creation of the universe (see Colossians 1:12-16). In Mark chapter 10 we read an account of certain Pharisees who came to the Master asking Him about the issue of divorce (see vss. 2-5). They cited Moses for giving a "bill of divorcement", at which Jesus said it was

because of the hardness of their heart. He continued His answer to them in verse 6 by saying, "But from the beginning of the creation God made them male and female." He then went on to infer that marriage was meant to be lifelong. Our Lord answered their question about divorce, but at the same time He answered all of mankind's question about "the beginning of the creation": it was at the time when Adam and Eve were created.

Some evolutionists mock at the idea that the universe is young. They point out the vast distances of space saying that light from stars that are millions of light years away from the earth must have taken millions of years to reach

this planet. That may sound reasonable, but we must realize that the Lord used what is called "apparent age" in His creation process. For instance, if I had seen Adam and Eve on the day after they were created, I would probably have believed that they were 20 or 30 years old. Imagine my surprise upon learning that they were only one day old! The same is true for the entire universe. God created it, including the light from the stars, in only six days, but it appears to be much older.

The teaching of "uniformitarianism" is used by evolutionists to try to prove that the earth is billions of years old. According to Webster's Dictionary, this word refers to, "a geological doctrine that existing processes acting in the same manner as at present are sufficient to account for all geological changes." For instance, these misguided scientists believe that by observing the rate of erosion upon rocks today, they can determine what the rate of erosion was in the past, and thus be able to determine the age of the earth, or parts of the earth.

An example of this is their attempt to give an age to the Grand Canyon in Arizona by trying to estimate how long it took the Colorado River to carve its way through this massive canyon. It is true that scientists can measure the rate of erosion from the Colorado River through various layers of the Grand Canyon today. If the erosion by this

river *had been* constant throughout the past, then the canyon could be millions of years old. What they don't take into account, however, is that the erosion of these rock layers was not begun by the Colorado River at all. The evidence indicates that the river began flowing through this canyon sometime after the canyon was already formed.

The most likely explanation for the forming of the Grand Canyon was the biblical Flood of Noah's day. We know that the Flood was worldwide, covering all of the earth's mountains (see Genesis 7:19,20). This vast amount of water would have had a tremendous eroding effect upon the earth, causing many of the geologic formations that we see today. We can observe the fast-acting force of water locally, as flooding cuts out grooves in the land to form gullies. The Grand Canyon could actually have been carved out in a relatively short period of time.

Evolutionists also try to point out that the earth's vast deposits of coal and oil would have taken millions of years to form. But this would not be the case when seen from the perspective of the worldwide Flood. The huge amounts of organic material needed to produce these coal and oil deposits could easily have been supplied from the remains of the plant, animal, (and yes, human) matter which were buried in the earth during the Flood.

It has been postulated, by some who believe in evolution, that the layers in the upper part of the earth's crust must have taken millions of years to be deposited. Once again, the doctrine of uniformitarianism is given as "proof". However, the Lord's use of "apparent age" in His creation could account for this, or the Flood may be the reason for these layers. The Flood would have carried many tons of soil in a mixture within its waters. This soil would have been deposited in layers around the earth as it dropped out of the mixture of the Flood's waters. Some of the layers would eventually have become rock.

That this actually happened from the Flood is seen by the petrified tree trunks that are suspended vertically through some of these rock layers. Apparently, as some of the trees which were floating in the Flood became "waterlogged" they began to be suspended vertically instead of horizontally. At some point, they sank to the bottom of the waters, still standing upright, and were buried beneath layers of soil. Over time, the trees and the soil turned to rock. Evolutionists have been puzzled by this phenom-


enon. Either they must admit that these trees were buried quickly, most likely by a flood, or else they must believe that the trees grew for millions of years through the layers of rock!

Other methods are used for "dating" the time when once-living organisms were alive. One of these is the radiocarbon method of dating. All living things contain radiocarbon, or carbon-14, and when they die, the carbon-14 begins to leave them. By measuring the amount of carbon-14 that a deceased specimen has is supposed to determine the age of that specimen. However, this is definitely not a fool-proof system. In one experiment where this dating method was used on the remains of a "mammoth", one side of the specimen gave an age of about 5,000 years, but the other side of the specimen gave an age nearer to 50,000 years.

Sometimes evolutionists will engage in what is called "circular reasoning", possibly without even knowing that they are doing it. A geologist, for example, will claim that a particular layer of rock is so many millions of years old because a dinosaur bone, supposedly that old, was found in that rock layer. A paleontologist will then claim that the dinosaur bone is that many years old because it was found in a rock layer that was supposedly of that age. The reasoning goes round and round in a circle, with neither side proving the age of the rock nor the age of the dinosaur bone.

We know that dinosaurs actually lived at the same time in the past with man. Footprints of both of these creatures have been found together on the ground's surface in Texas, embedded in rock. (The ground, at one time, had apparently been mud.) But we should not be surprised at a find such as this. The Bible indicates that Adam named "every living creature" (see Genesis 2:19). That would have included the dinosaurs. So we can see that millions of years are not needed to prove the existence of these beasts. The Lord made them on days five and six of Creation week.

Satan, through the subtil work of the evolutionists, is out to discredit the Bible as God's Word. By trying to do so, he wishes to destroy the faith of as many people as possible. Let us not allow him to do so. Rather, let us faithfully proclaim the Lord's Own testimony of, "For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is..."

HOMEOWNERS BATTLING THE REAL-ESTATE SLUMP PUT THEIR FAITH IN AN UNDERGROUND ALLY

BURYING ST. JOSEPH TO SUMMON RELUCTANT BUYERS

After three real estate agents, two price reductions, and nearly a year on the market left them with no offers on their Las Vegas town house, George and Katherine Grodin turned to a higher power for help.

They brought a 4-inch plastic figurine of St. Josephbelieved to be the patron saint of home and employment --and placed it upside down in their patio with hopes of breaking their home-selling slump.

"I just felt so helpless," said Katherine Grodin, 47, "I needed to do something."

The trick hasn't worked yet for the Grodins, but as the real estate market has continued to flag, a growing number of the faithful--and the desperate--have embraced the odd ritual of burying St. Joseph to clinch a quick sale.

Amazon sells St. Joseph figurines. So do True Value and Ace hardware stores.

Robert DiCocco, manager of the DiCocco Family St. Jude Shop in Havertown, Pa., said not a day went by

without someone coming into the store for a statue to help speed up a house sale.

"They're a little sheepish when they ask, 'What saint do I bury?' " said DiCocco, whose family business is one of the largest religious-goods stores on the East Coast.

The interest in St. Joseph, the husband of Mary, mother of Jesus, has a history in the real estate world.

During the busts of the 1980's and 1990's, agents and homeowners revived the tradition, which might date to medieval Europe. As the story goes, a group of nuns received a needed parcel of land for their convent after burying their St. Joseph medallions and praying to the saint for aid.

These days, most people opt for a kit like the ones sold by Philip Cates, a California mortgage banker and owner of St. Joseph Statue.com. He sells an 8-inch model for \$12.95. Typically, the kits include a figurine, a bag to bury it in, instructions and sample prayers.

Once the property sells, tradition calls for the seller to dig up the statue and keep it in a place of honor.

And if no one makes an offer? "Perhaps it's not time to sell," said Cates.

Debra Schneider was having trouble selling her custom-built home three years ago in Columbia County, New York, when a neighbor's relative suggested she bury a statue.

"I thought she was kidding me. I told her, 'I'm a Jewish yogi. I don't believe in that,' " said Schneider, 55.

The next day, though, she went and brought a statue, figuring she had little to lose. The house sold.

"Of course, I had lowered the price, which might have helped, too," Schneider said.

SPAIN LINKS VOODOO TO PROSTITUTION

23 arrested in ring trafficking in Nigerian women

by Victoria Burnett New York Times Madrid, Spain - Police say they have broken up a human-trafficking ring that forced Nigerian women into prostitution by threatening them with voodoo curses.

Authorities said Thursday that they arrested 23 people this week in raids in several Spanish cities after a Nigerian woman in Seville claimed she was a victim of the ring and reported its activities to the police in February.

The traffickers lured their victims with promises of a better life in Europe and took them to a voodoo priest before departure, the police said. The traffickers then smuggled them to Spain, where they told the victims they had to become prostitutes to repay a hefty debt for their journey or face the wrath of voodoo spirits.

Musililu Mojeed, a journalist for the Nigerian online newspaper 234Next.com who has written about voodoo and human trafficking, said voodoo, known as juju, was a fairly common tool of intimidation used by traffickers.

Women were taken to a voodoo shrine and made to swear before a priest that they would never reveal the identities of the traffickers, he said. The priest took pieces of fingernails or hair from the women's part of the ritual.


"People here are very scared of the power of voodoo, so the traffickers tell the victims that if they do anything funny they will invoke voodoo," Mojeed said.

"They fear death, illness, any misfortune the priest tells them," he added. "If the priest tells them they will get smallpox, then they believe they will catch smallpox."

Question: What is the meaning of the greeting, "Peace be to this house"?

promise of eternal inheritance" (Hebrews 9:15).

Question: What do you belive are the "idle words" for which men shall give account of that are mentioned in Matthew 12:36?

Answer: Let us quote the verse, "But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment."

These "idle words" may mean unseemly or improper conversation, levity, slander, scoffing, boasting, swearing, mocking at sacred things. Jesus had been speaking of blasphemy and of the scoffing attitude of the Pharisees, who imputed His miracles to Beelzebub. The "idle words" presumably referred more particularly to their sceptical way of accounting for the miracles of which they had spoken slightingly.

Question: Why must one study in order to be able to grow in grace?

Answer: We need to study in order to gain knowledge and to apply our minds unto prayerful thought to understand that which we have studied. We can only grow in grace through the knowledge of God. That is the way grace and peace may be multiplied unto those who believe. "Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord" (II Peter 1:2).

We can only obtain this knowledge by searching. This is what our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ said with His very own lips while here on the earth. "Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me" (John 5:39).

The Apostle Paul also commends the Bereans because they "were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11). Notice the word DAILY used here.

God is only willing to give more grace to the humble (James 4:6). If we say that we love Him, we will seek to know more about Him.

The Apostle Peter tells us, "And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (II Peter 1:5-8). Verse 9 tells us that "...he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins."

The apostle exhorts us in the 10th verse to "...give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall." We know that the "divine power" of our Lord and Saviour "...hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue" (vs. 3).

The apostle ends his second epistle with an exhortation which is very fitting for his time and also for our time. "Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own stedfastness. But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen" (II Peter 3:17-18).

Without studying the Scriptures, we will not be able to grow in grace and KNOWLEDGE. Neither can we expect to receive that divine power of God if we do not study to show ourselves approved.

If the desire for the sincere milk of the Word is not in us, then something must be seriously wrong. We are admonished by Peter to "...take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate

of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace" (Ephesians 6:13-15).

Putting on the whole armour of God is not like dressing in the morning by which within a few minutes you are fully clothed. It is a gradual process, a daily growth. Just as a parent would take his or her child each day to school to gain the vital knowledge which will prepare and serve him or her well in adult life, so in like manner, God wants us to learn of Him, that we may be prepared for any questions concerning the hope of our calling, or any trials which will arise during our spiritual growth. The Word of God tells us that if we are "...without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards and not sons" (Hebrews 12:8).

The Word of God teaches us, as children of God, that "...denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world" (Titus 2:12).

Having the sword of the Spirit is vital for every child of God to enable him to withstand against the wiles of the devil. We are told in Psalm 1:2 to delight in the law of the Lord and meditate on it day and night.

In the Old Testament, the Israelites were told, "Therefore shall ye lay up these my words in your heart and in your soul, and bind them for a sign upon your hand, that they may be as frontlets between your eyes" (Deuteronomy 11:18). "Now therefore fear the LORD, and serve him in sincerity and in truth: and put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood, and in Egypt; and serve ye the LORD. And if it seem evil unto you to serve the LORD, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD" (Joshua 24:14-15).

We must search, compare, and meditate on God's Word. "My mouth shall speak of wisdom; and the meditation of my heart shall be of understanding" (Psalm 49:3). "Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual" (I Corinthians 2:13).

All can be fitly summarized in the words of Job, "...I have esteemed the words of his mouth more than my necessary food" (Job 23:12). Just as with our daily meals, it is the quality of what we take in daily that will determine our growth.
